WINTER WEATHER ALERT

When winter temperatures drop, staying warm and safe can be a real challenge. Please make sure your child is dressed for the weather when they come to school. Here are some helpful hints from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities on how to keep your child safe in winter weather. Children should:

- wear layers of loose, dry clothing
- wear a heavy winter coat that is wind and water resistant
- wear boots that are water resistant
- wear a warm hat, scarf and mittens/gloves

When exposure to cold weather occurs for long periods, health emergencies such as hypothermia or frostbite can occur.
